Assist in the construction, maintenance, repair and remodeling of City facilities/structures and parks; perform less complex construction tasks and perform a variety of technical tasks relative to assigned areas of responsibility.

ESSENTIAL AND SUPPLEMENTAL FUNCTIONS:

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS: (Essential functions may include, but are not limited to the functions listed below)

1. Learn rough carpentry skills including the construction of forms, building additions, stairs and ramps.
2. Assist and participate in cement construction work for City buildings, parks and structures; construct forms for sidewalks, driveways, fence posts, gates, gutters, curbs, steps and walks; pour, level and finish cement.
3. Assist with a variety of construction tasks including masonry, block laying, painting, plumbing, basic electrical, minor welding, plastering, roofing, tiling, fence installation, sheetrock and tape texture work, digging, preparing and backfilling trenches.
4. Assist in installing paneling, drinking fountains and piping; building signs, and constructing, repairing and remodeling wooden, concrete, brick or metal buildings.
5. Operate a dump truck, mini-loaders and various types of small equipment.
6. Learn to perform finish carpentry; construct office furniture, cabinets, desks, shelving, conference tables, picture frames, ceiling and doors.
7. Learn to read blueprints, sketches and diagrams.
8. Adhere to safe work practices and procedures.

SUPPLEMENTAL FUNCTIONS:

1. Respond to public inquiries in a courteous manner.
2. Perform related duties and responsibilities as required.

MINIMUM EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS:

High school diploma or GED.
